ittle Women was first published as a children's book in 1868, making the story 154 years old this past September. This American classic, penned by Louisa May Alcott, has seen countless adaptations over the years, each giving us hints to contemporary concerns of the time.

What exactly is it that keeps readers coming back to this story, and draws playwrights to new adaptations? I believe that many people find themselves drawn to one – if not all – of the March sisters. They are beautifully fleshed out characters, guided by an indominable and caring mother, who each have unique and rich pathways in life. This doesn't seem like much, but in a world where women are often cast as secondary characters, there is inevitable appeal. At its heart, it's a story about growing up, the importance of family, and all of the complications faced along the way.

This contemporary adaptation by Kate Hamill does a wonderful job of inviting the production to bridge the classic that we know and love with the drive, wit, and sensibility of a contemporary text. The March sisters continue to be role models, this time with Jo expressly struggling with her gender identity – giving queer kids a significant opportunity to see themselves reflected at the center of a family story.

I hope you, dear audience, enjoy watching this play as much as I've enjoyed staging it with this extraordinary ensemble of creators and supported by this exceptional company; that your families feel the love, kindness, and spirit of the holiday season reflected in the care that this family has for each other. 

She is cofounder/ director of ARTICLE 11 with Andy Moro and based in Mohkinstsis. Beagan served as Artistic Director of Native Earth Performing Arts from February 2011 to December 2013. Beagan has been in residence at Cahoots Theatre, NEPA, the National Arts Centre, Berton House, and most recently Prairie Theatre Exchange. Seven of her 35 plays are published. Two plays have received Dora Award nominations (one

win). In 2018, Beagan was a finalist in the Alberta Playwrights' Network competition. In 2020, *Honour Beat* won the Gwen Pharis Ringwood Award for Drama. Beagan is a Dora and Betty nominated actor, and a director. Along with protégé Joelle Peters, Beagan is the 2020 laureate of the Siminovitch Prize for Theatre.

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FIVE FACTS ABOUT LOUISA May Alcott (1832-1888)

- Louisa May Alcott served as a nurse for the Northern Army during the American Civil War.
- She was a suffragette, fighting for the rights of women to vote in the United States. While she campaigned for this right in the 1870s, women were not granted the right to vote until 1920.
- Little Women was published in two parts (in 1868 & 1869) as a negotiation with a publisher on behalf of her father. Alcott went on to write two sequels, Little Men (1871) and Jo's Boys (1886).



- *Little Women* is a fictionalized autobiography of Alcott's own life growing up as a "tomboy" in a house of girls.
- Alcott's father founded an abolitionist society in 1850 to help end African slavery in the United States. Her childhood home in Massachusetts was a stop for fugitive enslaved people on the Underground Railroad.

HOW THE AMERICAN CIVIL WAR SHAPED THE ROLE OF WOMEN IN SOCIETY

The American Civil War was fought from 1861 to 1865 between the states in the northern United States and those in the south. The war began when 11 southern states threatened to secede (or withdraw) from the country.

- The Civil War challenged the concept of Victorian domesticity, where men and women existed in separate spheres.
- The 'home' became a new kind of domestic sphere when men left to serve in the war, and women took over the operation of the home.
- Women (and sometimes children) had to take men's places in factory jobs, office work, and for the United States government.
- Women played a significant role in the war effort, for the first time in American history.

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


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


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
